payment has already been made to Jones and Fortuna so this will allow it to be reimbursed. In other words, SWMO Water is paid up to date.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Roddy thanked the Board for the opportunity to serve the past year.

Held meeting with COE modelers and Jones and Fortuna and Hazen Sawyer on yields. This will affect how much everyone pays for storage.

Tri State taxes have been paid.

Also signed contract for Forvis services. In the past they had just sent terms---now are requiring re-signing each year. Checked with Skip and Steve first. Can provide agreement if desired.

Multiple meetings with COE on Reallocation Report and initial meetings on reallocation contract and costs.

Web Sites—revamped websites are now live. Being managed by Kim Spradling. It is set up as one site under umbrella of SWMO Water. Can access both JMUC and Coalition information. The host is now Siteground instead of Word press.

Steve suggested looking into registering “SWMO Water” with the Secretary of State.

Presented to James River Basin Partnership on March 17.

Sent letter to Governor in support of proclamation for “Lakes Appreciation Month”. Can provide a copy if interested. Talked with Skip and Steve before sending.

Did an interview with KSMU (Missouri State Public Radio Station) on the future of water in the region on March 16 in cooperation with CU.

Filled out form with Tim Eastin on renewal of insurance. The Board asked to bring back the cost of Cyber Security insurance that is being suggested by Tim.

Annual Water Conference- Planning for next Conference---Sept 26 Darr Center—possible keynote-Andy Mueller—General Manager of Colorado River District—tried but cannot fit it in. Roddy inquired as to Board input on possible speakers--Katherine Zitsch Director of Metro North Georgia Water as well as Lane Crider, the CEO of the Beaver Water District in Arkansas. Both could speak on their experience, ie positive effects of having a water source in place. The theme could be Positive Trends in Water Supply. North Georgia just received the largest allocation ever. The Board was affirmative on

this direction for the conference and also said that Sept 26 date immediately preceding MPUA would not hinder their attendance.

Attended NWSA conference in Washington April 3-6. Opportunity to talk with COE staff and other water organizations like ours. Update on current ASA (Connor) was that they anticipate unprecedented resources and that priorities include climate resilient infrastructure. As year three of the current administration approaches things will begin to change.

Jones and Fortuna activities

Held multiple meetings with Jones and Fortuna and Gilmore and Bell on reallocation contracts as well as JMUC contracts with individual entities. We have provided a template contract for each board member to look at. Once the COE decides on the allocation, and it is affirmative, each entity will need to either sign the contract or opt out of storage. To know how to structure the contracts—we really need to know CU/Spfd--MO Am/Joplin plans to take any of the reallocation now and their inclination to hold a reserve pool for minimal incremental cost.

Jones and Fortuna had a financial analyst evaluate financial aspects of reallocation.

Lathrop Gage—Files transferred. Since David Shorr passed away Dec 26. Board approved transferring files to Jones/Fortuna.

An invoice between Jones and Fortuna and us was intercepted and altered in an attempt to get us to electronically transfer funds. It was very well done and not at all readily identifiable. It was detected when Roddy called John (Fortuna) about what he thought to be John's directive to no longer do paper checks---and John informed him he did not write that in their invoice. Considerable time and effort to mitigate this. John called in a computer consultant (Bitsmith) immediately---since Jones and Fortuna transfers a lot of confidential and privileged info and (graciously) the consultant also logged in with Roddy to mitigate their presence in our/my system. At least one possible avenue for the hacker(s) appeared to be through Travis Cossey's email to SWMO work email account—so have talked with Travis too.

Ultimately— signed SWMO Water up with this support company (Bitsmith) going forward for stronger security for us to prevent this from happening again and devoted time working to change passwords, doing scans, and logging online with the consultant getting it set up. It could have been worse. It is \$150/month. Put one month on the Tri State credit card. This one Jones and Fortuna invoice was for \$20,000+, and had we gone forward with the ACH –the money could have ended up in another account besides ours or Jones and Fortuna's. So, believe well worth it financially. Not to mention the peace of mind.

Notwithstanding-- Roddy already had at least two layers of security. Consultant said this may go back to a Microsoft breach that effected 500,000 back in August—known as “middle man” scam. The company that hacked it appeared to be Russian based.

Asking for Board to approve the contract with the consultant. Felt like getting these cyber criminals blocked and out of our/my computer system as soon as possible to be a time of the essence thing. They can do a lot of damage very quickly. Can provide agreement if desired.

The Board wanted to get a report back from Roddy/BitSmith on their liability insurance and what cyber security that might provide.

Met with Jones Fortuna and possible subcontractor on possible future funding. JMUC Board approved enlisting the subcontractor.

OTHER BUSINESS

All Dues— Everyone is paid up now except Willard.

Next 2023 Meetings-- July 18, October 17

Skip and Steve discussed the possibility of writing a Delegation of Authority for Roddy to operate under. This would give authority for the Executive Director to make purchases or commitments up to a certain amount and beyond that would require Board approval.

CLOSED MEETING – Executive Committee

Contractual and legal discussions will be held in closed session, and only actions resulting from closed meeting will be included in the public minutes.

A motion to go into concurrent closed executive session with JMUC was made by Dan Johnson, seconded by Jason Choate and approved by the Tri State Board. This motion was also to adjourn back into the regular meetings upon conclusion of the closed session.

Attendance and Vote was taken by roll call.

A break was taken to allow non-Board members to depart from the meeting.

Open meeting was resumed at about 11:10 a.m.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at about 11:45 am by virtue of the earlier approved motion by Dan Johnson.
